



E-journals and e-books: Terms of use

Learn how to check whether you are allowed to use e-articles and e-book chapters in printed course packs or electronic course reserves (Blackboard).

SEARCH FOR THE RESOURCE

- 1 Go to the library webpage: library.au.dk/en/
- 2 Write the title of the article, e-journal or e-book in the search field and click Search.

- 3 Click on the record to view Details.

CHECK THE TERMS OF USE

- 4 Click on [Terms of use](#)
- 5 Find the information you need

Some articles or e-books are accessible on multiple platforms, which may differ on terms of use. It is therefore advisable to always check all the licence information

EXAMPLE

- 6 According to the Proquest licence you ARE permitted to upload the article to Blackboard.
 - 7 According to the Cinahl licence you are NOT permitted to upload the article to Blackboard.
- If you download the article from Proquest's platform, you may upload it to Blackboard.
