The **Thesaurus** is a controlled list of terms/concepts arranged alphabetically and hierarchically (in broader/narrower and related terms). The thesaurus is helpful if you need ideas for search terms.

child* OR adolescen* in Anywhere

AND abus* OR neglect* OR violen* in Anywhere

AND Truncate your search terms: abus*=abuse, abusive, abused etc. in Anywhere

+ Add a row - Remove a row

Limit to: Peer reviewed *i*

Publication date: All dates

Use **OR** to broaden your search and retrieve records containing any of the terms you include in your search.

Truncate your search terms: abus*=abuse, abusive, abused etc.

Use **AND** to narrow your search and retrieve records containing all of the terms you include in the search.

Limit to Peer reviewed material. Be aware that books and book chapters won't be included in the search result if you tick off this box.

Start by searching **Anywhere**. If it returns too many irrelevant titles, you can choose to search **Abstract** or **Subject Headings**

In **Recent searches** you can find your search history and combine your previous searches

Create a MyResearch account to save your searches and receive alerts on new research
